

Application for Cessation of Turf Cutting Compensation Scheme Restrictions on Turf Cutting

General Notes:

In order to compensate land owners and land users affected by the restrictions on turf cutting in designated raised bog candidate Special Areas of Conservation (cSAC) the State has put in place a cessation of turf cutting compensation scheme. This application form is in respect of the Cessation of Turf Cutting Compensation Annuity Payment Scheme. To qualify for this scheme the applicant must be able to demonstrate the following:

- 1. That the applicant has a legal interest in one of the 31 Raised Bog cSACs listed on page 4. The applicant must have had sole and exclusive right to cut and remove turf from the property on 25th May 2010.
- 2. That the applicant has been cutting turf on the said lands during the five year period up to the 25th of May 2010 and that the turbary right/turf resource has not been exhausted.
- 3. That no turf cutting or associated activity is ongoing on the property or has occurred during 2011.

Qualifying applicants will be required to enter into a legal agreement with the Minister for Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht. The Peatlands Council has been invited to review the compensation scheme and to make recommendations to the Minister. If, on foot of the Peatlands Council's recommendations, the Minister decides to amend any provision of the scheme, then such amendments will, with the agreement of the applicant, be retrospectively applied to any agreement entered into under this scheme before that date.

Relocation

As an alternative to financial payments, and where feasible, qualifying turf cutters will be facilitated in relocating to alternative non-designated sites to continue cutting turf. Please indicate on the form if you are interested in this option. Once the overall level of interest from qualifying turf cutters within a site or an area is established, further contact will be made with a view to assessing acceptable options. Applicants will receive payments under the annuity scheme until such time as alternative sites can be provided. The terms of the relocation will take account of any such payments made. Applicants will be given details of the proposed relocation site once finalised and may decide at that time to take up that option or opt out of the relocation scheme and continue with the annuity scheme.

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Detailed Notes:

NOTE 1: Section 1 – Applicant Details:

The applicant must fill out all relevant contact details. All applicants must provide their PPS number (a PPS Number is a unique number that may be obtained from the Revenue Commissioners or the Department of Social Protection). Your date of birth and Mother's birth surname are required to verify the PPS Number given.

All applicants must provide details of the relevant folios under which their application is made and a map identifying clearly their bog plot or location of turbary right on the cSAC.

Applicants interested in the relocation option must indicate their interest by ticking the relevant box.

Failure to provide these details will render the application invalid and it will be returned to the applicant unprocessed.

Please see NOTE 5 for details of how to verify Title and the additional note in Section 2 of the attached form regarding applications where Title cannot be clearly shown.**

NOTE 2: Section 2 – Qualifying Criteria:

In order to qualify for the Annuity Payment Scheme, the applicant must choose a Yes or No option to each of the assertions in this section.

In that regard the applicant must have had sole and exclusive right to cut and remove turf from the property on which they are seeking compensation prior to or on 25th May 2010. Proof of Title by this date must be shown on the folio or documentation provided to prove such Title to lands/rights.

The applicant must have been cutting turf for domestic purposes, on those said lands during the previous 5 years up to the 25th of May 2010. To establish the level of turf extraction on the site the Department will refer to its records of aerial surveys taken over this period.

To qualify under the scheme for payment in 2011 turf must not have been cut from, or any associated activities carried out on, the applicant's bog plot in the year 2011 Where turf has been cut in 2011 applicants will not qualify for payment in 2011 but may qualify for payment from 2012 and payments will be restricted to a maximum of 14 years. Such applicants should apply now giving details of their situation.

Where the turbary right/turf resource has been exhausted there will be no entitlement to compensation.

Failure to complete this Section will render the application invalid and it will be returned to the applicant unprocessed.

Please also see the additional note in Section 2 of the attached form. **

NOTE 3:

The Department will carry out a site inspection to verify the details that have been provided.

Failure to provide unencumbered access to Officials/Agents of the Department to the subject lands will render the application invalid and it will be returned to the applicant unprocessed.

Site inspections will be carried out regularly to ensure that no turf cutting is taking place on the bog plot in question. Payment of compensation will be affected if turf cutting or associated activity occurs on the property.

NOTE 4:

Applicants may attach additional information or documentation, if required, in support of their application.

NOTE 5:

If the turbary right is an **appurtenant turbary right** then the applicant <u>must</u> supply a Special Features map (also available from the Property Registration Authority) clearly showing the property outlined in red.

For those who own Turbary Rights only

If the turbary right could be from the **Irish Land Commission** or the **Congested Districts Board**, a search can be carried out to see if a **Q3 Agreement** exists in your name or your family's name. Following this search or if the Applicant already knows that the turbary right is tied to Irish Land Commission lands by Q3 Agreement, order the following in writing from the Records Branch at the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM), upon payment of the appropriate fee:
