**NOTE:** The law states that the minimum calibre weapon for hunting deer is **a rifle of not less than .22 calibre** with a muzzle energy of **not less than 1,700 foot pounds**, which uses bullets weighing not less than 55 grains as per S.I. No. 239 of 1977.

However, the Irish Deer Management Forum have recommended **a minimum** calibre of .243 and a bullet weight of 100 grains
