This license application is being requested to carry out endoscope surveys only. This will involve minimal risk of disturbance and will only be performed to check potential roosting features in trees and to record the presence or not of bat species.

The survey is required to follow best practice guidelines (*Collins, J. (ed.) (2023) Bat Surveys for Professional Ecologists: Good Practice Guidelines (4th edition). The Bat Conservation Trust, London.*) to accurately identify the baseline bat roost population that may be at risk from a proposed road scheme. The survey findings will more accurately inform mitigation to be detailed in the Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) for the proposed N11/ N25 road scheme.

The number of individual and breeding/resting sites of bats in potential roost features in trees that would be removed as part of the scheme is currently unknown. The surveys are intended to determine the suitability of potential roosting features in trees and note presence and species of any bats recorded. This will help better inform impacts from the scheme and appropriate mitigation to reduce impacts to bat populations locally in Co Wexford. If the survey is not done, then there is a risk that adequate information on bat roosts will not be known for the EIAR.
