Part 1.

Personal Details

All personal details to be completed, including a valid email address. If all details are not completed, the form could be returned to the applicant therefore causing delays in processing.

Qualifications/Experience in this field of Activity:

Please supply details of your qualifications/experience. Copies of support documentation can be submitted along with this application.

Are you affiliated with an Organisation?

If you are affiliated to an organisation in this field – please list name of the organisation.

Part 2.

Details of Bird/Animal

Please include the species of bird/animal, the age (if known) and gender on the form.

Name and Address of Person who found the Bird/Animal:

The name and address of the person/persons who found the bird should be recorded.

Location and Date found:

The location and the date that the bird/animal was found should be recorded on the application form. This will assist if/when bird/animal is being returned to the wild.

Description of Injuries

Please provided a description of the injuries to the bird/animal when first present to you.

Veterinary Examination

Yes/No choice. If yes — please include the vets report with this application. If no — you must provide a reason as to why the bird/animal was not referred to a vet.

Period of which licence is required

This time period should be adequate enough for a full rehabilitation of the bird/animal being treated.

Part 3.

Declaration

This form should be signed and dated by the applicant. If this form is being completed online – a digital signature is acceptable. If the application form is not signed – it will be returned to the applicant.
