Other Site Characteristics

This turlough is set in rolling countryside over 3km from the nearest river (Robe). It has some rock exposures on the northern edge and also in a central rise. Vegetation diversity is high because of the presence of long-lasting water in ditches and abandoned peat cuttings. The habitats are fairly oligotrophic and there is some precipitation of marl (CaCo3).

4.2 Quality and importance

Skealoghan is of considerable value because of the high level of diversity in flora and fauna (eg. birds). The

vegetation is well developed and, although controlled by grazing, is not significantly damaged by it. The site was rated 19th overall in an evaluation of major Irish turloughs in 1990.
